Activities

Outside Nature Walk

Go outside with your children and collect various flowers, leaves, and rocks. Then compare which items are bigger or smaller. Maybe you can make artwork with what you’ve found!

Tupperware Drum Set

Do you have tupperware kitchen containers or pots of different sizes? Gather them on the table and tell your child to “drum” on the smaller objects, then the bigger objects. Compare the sounds, play Simon Says, and have fun!

Order Straws by Size

Cut fun-colored plastic straws and have your children “draw straws” (select them without knowing how big each one is). Then compare the sizes.
